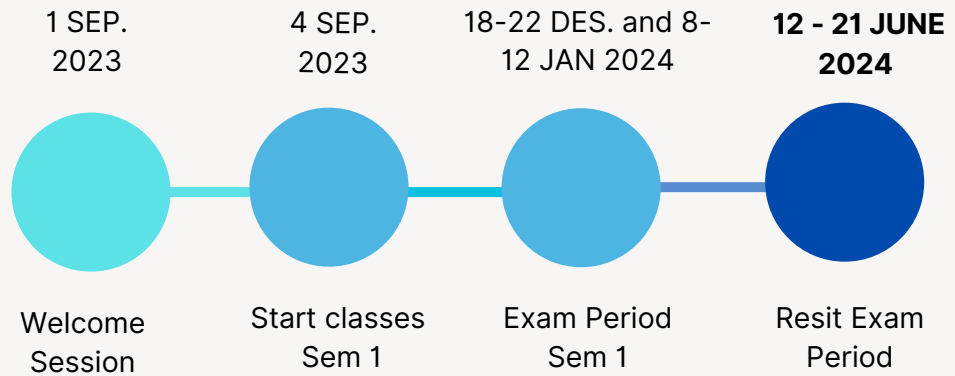

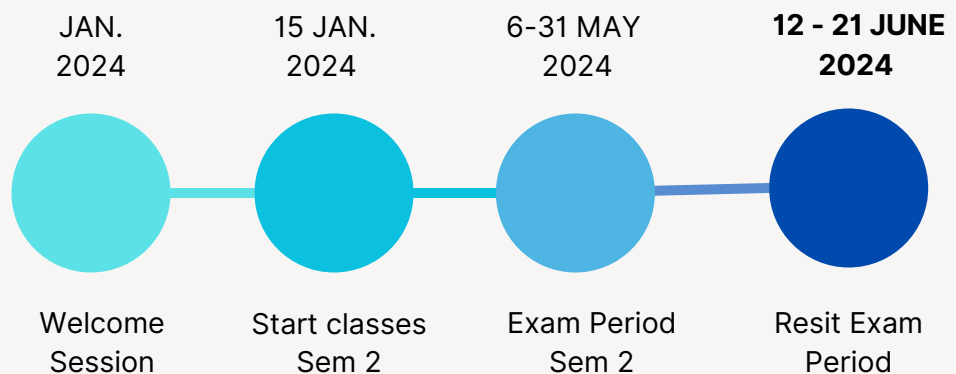

#### Language requirements

Language of instruction

All 3rd, 4th and 5th year subjects will be taught in Spanish. On the "English Programme" the 1st and 2nd year subjects will be taught in English.

Required level of Spanish

A **B1 level of Spanish** is required for subject taught in Spanish. Students from Spanish-speaking countries in Latin America are exempt from language accreditation.

Required level of English

A **B2 level of English** is required for subjects taught in English.

Certificates

An official language certificate is required. Otherwise, the certificate must be issued by a language school, or a language professor/department from your home university.

Certificates obtained by taking the Erasmus OLS Mobility Test will **not** be accepted.

## STEP 2

### Other academic information

#### Attendance

- Attending classes is compulsory.
- It is the student's responsibility to choose subjects that do not clash.

#### Teaching model

- In-person classroom model.

#### Other regulations

- The examination calendar is fixed. If there is a request to change the date or time of an exam for an exceptional and justified reason, this must be applied for via an official application called an "Instancia" and in sufficient time.
- Exam revision dates are fixed and must be undertaken in person.

#### How to make a complaint/official request

- Official requests will be processed via the International Relations Department. Before making an official request, it is recommended that you speak with your academic coordinator.

## STEP 2

### Other academic information

Does the faculty allow students to do work placements?

- Yes.

#### Material required

- Clinical footwear (preferably clogs)
- The uniform for clinical work experience will be provided by the University.
- A €600 deposit is required for the instrument box.

#### Vaccines

- Information will be sent at a later date with details of the vaccines that students must have had.

Are students allowed to extend their stay?

- You can request an extension by sending an application to the academic coordinator, who will send it on to the Faculty Board.
- The specific requirements for extending your stay can be asked to the University.

## STEP 6

### Changes in LA

Once classes have begun and for a period of approximately **2 weeks** students can change the subjects they are enrolled for.

#### How to proceed

- 1 Contact your academic coordinator at UIC Barcelona.
- 2 If the academic coordinator at UIC Barcelona approves the changes, contact the academic coordinator at your home university.
- 3 If the academic coordinator in your home university approves the changes, students must make the changes by following these instructions:
  - **Erasmus mobility students - studies:** See document "How to manage my mobility at UIC Barcelona? (Appendix 1)".
  - **Erasmus mobility students work placements / bilateral agreements / visitors / SICUE:** See document "How to manage my mobility at UIC Barcelona? (Appendix 2)".

**No** further changes to the Learning Agreement will be accepted after the deadline indicated.
